SHOOT MARSHALL POLICY

POLICY No.12

PROCEDURE

The rules of the Australian Clay Target Association (2006) state the following in relation to the duties of a "Shoot Marshall"

4.23 DUTIES OF A SHOOT MARSHALL

- (a) He must observe all the duties of the official referee.
- (b) He must be present at all shoot-offs.
- (c) He must see that all traps are checked for correct height and angles during competition and prior to shoot-off.
- (d) The shoot marshal shall be in charge of all operations and personnel, including referees relating to the shoot, and shall be responsible only to the Management.
- (e) He must instruct and roster the duties of all personnel prior to the commencement of each day's shooting.

To comply with requirements for insurance and other purposes all clubs are to ensure that they have a designated Shoot Marshall for every event and that the Shoot Marshall is made aware of their duties prior to competition commencing.

In the instance of an injury or serious breach of ACTA shooting rules, the Shoot Marshall may be required to furnish a statement to the relevant authority outlining their duties on the day of the incident, their qualifications and any other information that may be relevant to the investigation.

All clubs that are affiliated with SACTA shall ensure that the Shoot Marshall is clearly identified prior to and during competition and is a member with sufficient experience to undertake their duties as identified in the ACTA rules.

This policy is to be read in conjunction with all SACTA policies, the Shooting Rules of the Australian Clay Target Association and the South Australian Firearms Act and Regulations.

Note: Any reference to "he" includes "she"
Any reference to "injury" includes "death"
